We are counting, counting and counting. We are continuing to learn about what number is and next week we will continue working with different numbers and you guessed it more counting and identifying how many items are in a set. The students are learning about friendly numbers that we can use to make our counting easier. Three of our friendly numbers are two, five and ten. We can count by fives so if we group items in sets of five the groups should be easy to count.
